

Box Car "Shorthand" Data

There are many types of data painted on railroad rolling stock that all provide useful information to assure safe railroad operation. Many abbreviations are known by railroad personnel and not the general public. Some refer to this data as train car shorthand. This brief writeup summarizes what the shorthand means. The information presented is taken from a presentation by Greg Hurd.


This grouping of data defines the size of box car and usable volume of the cars. It can be at either side of a box car door.






This photo shows where the dimensions apply.




This data contains a unique identification number of the box car and weight capacity of the car. Other information found in this grouping is at the owner of the car's discretion. This data is most often located at the opposite end of the car as the dimensional data.



The ends of a box car can have data as well as the sides. The B end of a car is where the hand brake wheel is located.
